Day 1: LIMA

Upon arrival from your international flight, you will be transferred to your hotel for an overnight in Lima, the nation's capital and largest city.

Day 2: LIMA/IQUITOS - breakfast & dinner

Today will begin very early in order to give us time to eat breakfast and catch our flight, where we'll meet our transfer to our Amazon River ship, our privately chartered home for the next seven days.

Day 3: MARANON RIVER/AMAZON RIVER/UCAYALI RIVER – breakfast, lunch & dinner After breakfast, we have an excursion on the Amazon and some of its tributaries to see the rain forest. This will be our chance to see monkeys, sloths and a variety of birds.

Once back onboard, we'll gather for lunch, followed by a presentation on the Amazon River. Afterwards, we'll walk along the shores of the Ucayali River, located in the Yucuruchi region of the Amazon where we'll be able to spot the Victoria Regia water lily – a gigantic aquatic plant.

Day 4: MARANON RIVER/PACAYA SAMIRIA NATIONAL RESERVE/SHAMAN VISIT – breakfast, lunch & dinner Today we will rise early to visit the Pacaya-Samiria Reserve for a full day of discovery in Peru's largest national park.

Before returning to the ship for dinner, we'll encounter the spirit realm with a visit to a local shaman. Mystic, minister, healer – one may consider a shaman to be 'all of the above'. But to understand shamanism requires somewhat of a leap of faith – or a leap into the spirit world that is the shaman's domain.

Day 5: MARANON RIVER/PACAYA SAMIRIA NATIONAL RESERVE – breakfast, lunch & dinner

The early morning offers another opportunity to watch the world awakening in the rain forest – perhaps you'll spot iguanas, river turtles, and cormorants or wattled jacana during this excursion.

We'll return to our riverboat and prepare to meet a local Indian family.

Be sure to be well rested, so that you won't miss our late night excursion to discover those that creep in the night! We'll join our guide for a nighttime boat ride into the wild for an adventure.

Day 6: MARANON RIVER/PACAYA SAMIRIA NATIONAL RESERVE - breakfast, lunch & dinner

Today, we'll rise early and set out to explore the impressive biodiversity of this unusual ecosystem. We'll look for a quiet spot to enjoy our picnic breakfast, followed by a trip to explore the Choroyacu. We'll also visit Choroyacu Creek where we'll have the opportunity to climb in a dugout canoe and explore this scenic area with the local.

Dinner will be interesting this evening. We'll be attending a local jungle cooking lesson – and then enjoying our results for dinner.

We'll have another chance to witness the nocturnal life of the rainforest after dinner as we venture out in small boats onto the Maranon River.

Day 7: NAUTA/SAPISAPI RIVER - breakfast, lunch & dinner

It's back to civilization today, as our ship returns to its home port of Iquitos, but before we dock, we have a few more unique experiences to look forward to.

This morning, we'll call on the town of Nauta, where the Ucayali and Maranon – the major headstreams of the Amazon - join together. On our included tour, we'll ride the local motorcars and browse the local markets. You are welcome to try your hand at bargaining! Continuing on our way, we'll visit the Sapisapi River to look for charapas and turtles. The river has given up its secrets – or at least some of them.

At night, we'll celebrate our discoveries at our Farewell Dinner Party, complete with live music, aboard our ship.

Day 8: IQUITOS/LIMA - breakfast

After breakfast we will bid farewell to the Amazon Riverboat. We'll disembark very early this morning in Iquitos and board our flight to Lima. Once in Lima, you will be transferred to your comfort hotel for the night.

Day 9: LIMA - breakfast
