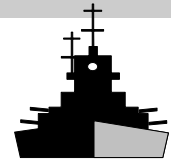

### **2007 CVSC Livermore Bike Ride – The Alternate Ride—The “Rough Riders” Story by Wayne Ainsworth**

The Riders:

Wayne Ainsworth (organizer), Elizabeth Yagle (route consultant), Wendell Jeong (route consultant), Jacky Poulsen, Bruce Anderson, Bruce Shine, Steve Tracy, Steve James, Astra Gabriel, Dean Michael

The Route:

We started at the corner of South Livermore Avenue and Chateau Way. This is across the street from the Livermore public library. Oddly enough, although this location was identified in the newsletter and in a separate email to riders, only Jacky managed to join Elizabeth and Wayne at the official starting point. The other riders did not have their GPS units with them and, consequently, had no idea of where to meet. We found them at the library, commingling with the wine tasting contingent. After joking about map reading skills, or lack thereof, we set off on our non-wine tasting alternative bike ride.

South on S. Livermore Ave for a block to Concannon Blvd.; Right (west) on Concannon to Wente Street. Actually, we rode on a relatively new bike trail on the south side of the boulevard and then turned on to Wente Street. We took Wente to Marina and climbed gradually until we came to Arroyo Road, then Left onto the bike path that parallels Arroyo on the south side of the road. When we came to the Ravenswood

Historical Site, we crossed to the other side of Arroyo and continued south on another bike path, climbing gently to Wetmore Road. From there, it was all downhill to Sycamore Grove Park, opposite the Wente champagne cellars and golf course. After a brief bio-break at the park entrance, we meandered three miles through the park, stopping occasionally to view the local fauna: raptors, wild turkeys, cattle, and deer. Once through the park, we took a left on Wetmore and followed it a short distance to Vallecitos Road.. Another left onto Vallecitos, a long block, and then a right onto Vineyard. Vineyard is a nice, relatively old, two-lane road that took us to Isabel Avenue, that is anything but quiet. Fortunately, after turning right on Isabel, we had to ride only a block until we were able to exit onto the broad bike path that parallels Isabel. On this path, we were able to ride side-by-side and talk about the great ride we were enjoying. Continuing along this path, and gradually climbing, we eventually came to the Arroyo Mocho bike trail that would take us back to our starting point. The tree-shrouded Arroyo Mocho trail winds through the neighborhoods that encompass downtown Livermore. You are in the middle of the city but, at the same time, isolated from the traffic. This was a blessing since our ride was taking place at the same time as the annual Livermore Rodeo. We observed people and cars streaming in to Robertson Park where the rodeo was being held. At this point, we were almost back to our starting point. Only a couple more blocks to go before we could focus our attention on lunch at the Trio restaurant. Most of us decided to ride the additional mile to the restaurant just to build up more of an appetite. I enjoyed being able to get out with our fellow club members for this leisurely ride around Livermore. A special thanks to John Fagan who organized the lunch that followed the two bike rides. It was a sumptuous finale to a fabulous morning.

The wine tasters were joined by Steve & Astra from the 'Rough Riders' group after lunch, and we imbibed at Stoney Ridge and Concannon wineries.

Our Thanks to John Fagan for heading up this event! It was a perfect way to spend a lovely late spring Saturday.

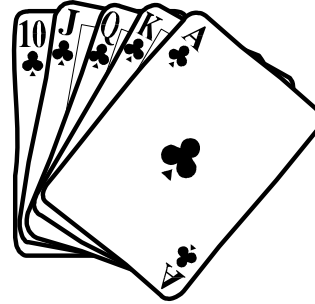
## WHITE WATER KAYAKING
