We finally have snow! Racing season will get underway on Feb 11th and 12th with GS races at Northstar. This will be a nice start to the season. Hopefully the weather will be accommodating. Then we have races Feb 25th and 26th at Sugarbowl.

We are all reminded of a few basic truths with the racing league:



Figure that any clinic or race is ON, until we are told different. The league board is experienced and on top of the conditions, so we should get a read-out by Wednesday before the Keith Wilson Race Director

event, but it could be Thursday. I will watch too, and relay any message I get ASAP. The league notifies the race directors first.

I figure that is not worth skiing or boarding until the resort claims at least 36" of base. The base is usually inflated early in the season. Less than 36" usually means you will damage your skis or board by hitting rocks. Sometimes 36" is not enough; 60" is safe.

Check Caltrans, road conditions if we get a storm within 24 hours of your trip (1-800-427-7623). The roads are usually cleared 12 hours after the storm ends. Sometimes it just rains on the roads.

Registration for races and clinics is 8 AM to 8:45 AM. It will be easy to find the registration area because not too many others are at the resort that early. Races and clinics usually start 9:30 AM or 10 AM. Early in the season, the league starts the 8-10's first, then the 5-7's (intermediates), then the 0-4's (advanced). Later in the season, the starting-order changes.

It is not too late to join the Castro Valley race team; since, we have not had a race. There is plenty of the racing-season left. Call me; email me (keithwilson108@ sbcglobal.net) whatever. Just do it at least one week before the next race so it will count. Otherwise, show up on registration day by 8:00 AM and I will get you on the course as a "courtesy racer".

For anyone who would like to try racing, come on up for a weekend. Anyone can try the racecourse for a small fee that can be applied to league registration. Just be there by 8AM. Or call me for more information at 925-828-8265 (H) of 549-1715 (C).

From the secretary's desk..... by Eva Lanphear

After being reminded this week at the January meeting of the support our club provides to the DSUSA Snow Season Program, it seemed appropriate to also highlight another program the club supports.

Last year Karen reported at a membership meeting that our Board approved a sum of \$1000.00 to sponsor a youth racer in training through the FWSA Scholarship Foundation. Unfortunately the youth, who is from Castro Valley, had a ski injury which took him out for the season.

In October, 2011, the board closed out a program for Parallelers club members who had merged with CVSC several years ago and brought their Sitzmark cabin fund with them. When the Sitzmark cabin lease was terminated, members of the Parallelers club were given an opportunity to use the Siegfried condo for two nights per member to be funded by the Sitzmark cabin fund. All members of the Parallelers club were given a year and one-half to take advantage of that offer. On September 30th, 2011, the offer expired.

At the October, 2011 board meeting, it was approved that the Sitzmark Cabin fund be set aside to fund, on an annual basis, for the next five years, a \$1000.00 scholarship through the FWSA Scholarship Foundation for a youth racer.

The first racer to be approved was Foreste Peterson.

Foreste Peterson is an 18 year old senior at Berkeley High School in Berkeley, CA. To balance her demanding ski training and competition, Foreste completes most of her academic work through the Berkeley High School Independent Study Program where she maintains a 3.95 GPA and is a member of the National Honors Society. In 2010 she was awarded the City of Berkeley Mayor's Award for Excellence in Sports, Academics and Spirit. Her family is deeply involved in skiing. Her father has acted as her tech, tuning and waxing her skis for competition. Her older sister, Hilary, is a senior at the University of Colorado and the captain of the women's ski team.

Foreste was selected for the U.S. Ski Team's Development team in 2010 but missed most of the 2010-2011 ski season due to a broken ankle. A superb technical skier, her achievements include: 1st place in GS, 1st in Combined, and 2nd in Slalom at the 2010 J-2 Nationals; 3rd place in GS and the Super Combined at the 2010 U.S. Nationals; 1st place in GS at the 2010 Elite FIS Tech Series; and 1st place in Slalom at the 2010 2 Elite FIS Slalom Series. She was ranked as the top J-2 female racer in the Far West and Western Region, and one of the top 3 in the United States.

Foreste was featured on the Beta Vivo Girls Sports website (6/27/11) where she was recognized as a fitness and nutrition expert. She has been a guest speaker on numerous occasions and is a motivational speaker for the U.S. Ski Team at the Center of excellence in Park City. For the past two years, she has been a part of the Far West Masters Scholarship Program and the Lake Tahoe Ski Club Foundation for which she foreruns at special races, helps at banquets, speaks at fundraisers, and sells raffle tickets.

It should be noted that USST C and D team members are responsible for raising \$20,000 to finance their training and racing. The U.S. Ski Team only fully covers expenses for the A and B teams. Foreste has set her goal on making the 2014 Olympic team. She has a long hard road to go.
