Safety Person of the Year Western Ski Heritage Club Historical Recognition Charity and Community Service

This month I want to discuss the first, the

Safety Person of the Year. This award recognizes the person who has shown safety leadership by effectively promoting snow sports safety aware-

ness. This can include but is not limited to writing safety newsletter articles, creating safety banners or signs, speaking or arranging for professional or semi-professional safety speakers, volunteering for the Ski Patrol, learning and teaching members safety practices, showing safety videos and/or creating a written club safety policy. The award is open to any member of a Far West Club. The candidate must be nominated either by their club or by the BAC. The Safety Award is a crystal trophy and typically a 7-night ski/board package for two with lodging, lift tickets, rentals, air transportation

#### A DAY AT THE RACES.....

Races coming up this weekend are now at Heavenly Valley, Feb 8, 9. If you have the season pass that includes Heavenly Valley, you can check this out. Race courses are on the California side at the East end of the parking lot. Registration is in the California Lodge. These will be slalom races. Check it out!

Our next big event is the **Super G** at Northstar, Feb 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>th</sup>. This event includes a

clinic on Saturday, Feb 22<sup>nd</sup> and a race the next day. This is one fun event! Here is a rea-Race Director son to go for pure speed on a race course – just for fun. The race group is usually moderate in size and the instruction is guaranteed to improve your skiing. If you want to try one race event, this is it! It does not count for anything. For more information, go to the Open League website (www.olrc.org) and follow the link to Super G. Races beyond that are on March 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> at Alpine Meadows.

Check Caltrans, road conditions if we get a storm within 24 hours of your trip (1-800-427-7623). The roads are usually cleared 12 hours after the storm ends. Sometimes it just rains on the roads. If you do travel in a snow storm, remember some lessons from **Crested Butte**. It helps to have tires rated for mud and snow. (Look for the raised letters M+S on the side of the tire.) It also helps to have "all wheel" or "four wheel" drive. In California, if the storm is bad enough that chains are required on "four wheel" drive vehicles, the road will be closed

There is a myriad of information on the Open League website, www.olrc.org. You can go there for links to weather and conditions at your favorite ski resorts and to check for changes in the race schedule.

Races usually start at 9:30 AM or 10 AM. Early in the season, the league starts the 8-10's first, then the 5-7's (intermediates), then the 0-4's (advanced). Later in the ski season the starting order changes.

It is almost too late to join the Castro Valley race team. There is plenty of the racing-season left. Call me; email me (keithwilson108@sbcglobal.net) whatever. Just do it at least one week before the next race so it will count. Otherwise, show up on registration day by 8:00 AM and register as a "courtesy racer".
